Week nine saw Fairness in Girl's Sports and Eddie the Eagle pass both chambers of the legislature. Girl's Sports passed for the third year in a row, and this year it has a supermajority. Both chambers heard and took action on bills steadily through the week. March 24th marks the last day for most committees to meet before first adjournment. The next two weeks will most likely be marked by bigger/more controversial bills going to the floor. Below are the two bills that passed, as well as the bills that had their hearing and/or had action taken in committee this week.

### Bills Passed In Both Chambers

**Fairness in Girls' Sports.** HB 2238 is about fairness and valuing women. We believe in science, which states that there are two genders: male and female. Women are valuable, and supporting competition between females and biological males who identify as "females" devalues women. During the hearing for this bill, radicals suggested that asking questions regarding the LGBTQXYZ+ issue, much less submitting bills, was killing kids and increasing depression. In actuality, depression and suicidal rates among children, especially those with gender dysphoria, are increasing because of the LGBTQICW agenda. This agenda idolizes one's personal sexual gratification above all else. It eliminates the satisfaction, security, and sense of purpose found in being raised by traditional mother-and-father family unit while striving to create its own fake versions of these qualities. Virtue-signaling adults push this agenda to feel better about themselves—not to help children. This sexualizing of children and propagation of individual sexual gratification above all else will continue to degrade the mental, physical, and spiritual health of our nation.

## Bills Passed In One Chamber

**Women's Bill of Rights.** Passed Committee on Health and Human Services.

SB 180, or the Women's Bill of Rights, aims to protect women from infringements on their liberties by clarifying who women actually are and by stating the rights to which they are entitled. According to the bill, women, or biological females, have historically suffered discrimination based on their sex. This has carried on into the modern day, with biological males, who claim to be trans women, joining women's sports teams and entering their restrooms and changing rooms. In order to promote equal rights for women, SB 180 clearly states that the identity of a woman is defined by science and that separate facilities for men and women are not unequal—rather, they protect women from potential predators—including in state prisons. The bill goes on to require that public entities that collect information in order to observe anti-discrimination laws, such as schools and state agencies, identify the sex assigned at birth of the individuals in their data sets.

## Bills Passed Committee

**Born Alive.** Passed Committee on Health and Human Services

HB 2313 would require babies who were born during and/or survived an abortion to be protected. Currently, babies who come out of the mother alive during an abortion are left to die. This is unacceptable and needs to be changed. If the same baby and mother were in a hospital, massive resources, personnel, and effort would be used to save the child.
